Last month, all underclassmen students began the course selection process, and should have met with their school counselor at this point to review their course requests. Course verification sheets should be distributed in homerooms soon, so double check those selections and be sure to hand them in with a parent signature! We are also in the midst of junior post-high school planning meetings with students and their parents, which will be a major focus in March. Juniors will also be sitting for the CT School Day SAT on the 25th, so they have a few busy weeks ahead! Fingers crossed for no more snow days and lots of health for staff and students!

CT SAT School Day REMINDER for Juniors! March 25, 2020

- Students should review the <u>SAT School Day Student</u> <u>Guide</u> to become familiar with the test and to make sure they understand SAT policies and regulations before they take the test.
- If a student wants to remove the March 25, 2020, Connecticut SAT School Day exam score from their College Board record of SAT scores, they must complete a *Request to Cancel Score Form*, which will be available on test day. Alternatively, they can fax their signed request to: 610-290-8978, or send by overnight mail to SAT Program, Score Cancellation, 1425 Lower Ferry Road, Ewing, NJ 08618 within three days of the administration. SAT scores from the March 25, 2020 Connecticut SAT School Day exam will still be used by the CSDE for school and district accountability purposes.
- Optional! Four Free Score Sends: Students can enter their four free score sends directly on their answer sheet. The codes for colleges and universities where students send scores are available in the student answer sheet instructions that will be distributed to each student on test day. Reminder...If you chooses to use your four free score sends, you are agreeing to send your SAT scores to the selected colleges, without having seen the scores.


