Access to Out-of-State Programs at Lower Tuition for New England Residents

Regional Student Program, Tuition Break Enrollment Increased at 40% of colleges despite challenging year



The 2020-21 academic year was a year like no other as a pandemic caused unprecedented disruptions on college campuses.

The majority of New England public colleges and universities saw overall enrollment *decreases* in Fall 2020. However, 40% of them saw increases in enrollment of students who were eligible through NEBHE's Tuition Break, the Regional Student Program (RSP), according to the program's <u>2020-21 Annual Report</u>, based on NEBHE's survey of RSP participating institutions.

Nationally, Fall 2020 enrollment declined by 2.5% overall, nearly twice the rate of decline reported in Fall 2019, according to the National Student Clearinghouse Dec. 2020 report, *Current Term Enrollment Estimates, Fall 2020*. Public colleges and universities saw a 4% decrease from Fall 2019 enrollment, and community colleges saw a 10% decrease.

Total enrollment in Fall 2020 through Tuition Break was 9,142 – down 1% from Fall 2019. Community colleges saw a 12% decrease. Combined undergraduate and graduate enrollment at four-year colleges and universities through Tuition Break increased about 1%.

Significant Savings on Tuition

A full-time student enrolled through Tuition Break in 2020-21 saved an estimated average of \$8,300.

Participating students saved an estimated total of \$63.1 million on their 2020-21 tuition bills

More than 2,000 Eligible Programs

Popular programs enrolling Tuition Break students this year include: allied health, business administration, cybersecurity, homeland security, justice studies, marine sciences, mechanical engineering, nursing, pharmacy, physiology and neurobiology, wildlife ecology and zoology.

The <u>participating colleges and universities</u> allow eligibility for a wide array of degree programs, including specialized programs that are not offered by public colleges in students' home-state.

Some colleges offer additional programs under the <u>flexible programs policy</u>, which took effect in Fall 2019 for four-year campuses. NEBHE engages the participating institutions in an annual review to approve programs.

Through Tuition Break, New England residents are eligible to pay a <u>tuition rate</u> that is significantly lower than the regular out-of-state rate when they enroll in approved programs offered by out-of-state public colleges and universities within the six-state region.
