Connecticut SAT School Day Info for Juniors

Fairfield Ludlowe High School will administer the Connecticut School Day SAT (without essay) on April 9, 2019. There is <u>no</u> cost for students to take the Connecticut SAT School Day administration and they will be <u>automatically registered</u> for the test. Testing will take place in our gymnasiums and select areas of the school. Students will be assigned to locations by their house assignment.

<u>February 1-8</u>: Teachers will spend class time discussing department courses and their recommendations, and signing the Course Selection Worksheet

<u>February 8</u>: Completed, signed Course Selection Worksheet due to your school counselor.

February 11-27: Schedule an appointment with counselor to enter final course selections into Infinite Campus.

<u>March 5</u>: Discuss and enter your final course selections into Infinite Campus. Your school counselor will provide a printed copy of your requested courses. Final Course Selection Worksheet due to counselor.

Young Playwrights Festival, "Script to Stage" Overview

This is a nine- week complimentary program for 15 students in grades 8th-12th meeting once a week for 2 1/2 hr sessions at The Palace Theatre.

Fridays; Feb 1, 8, March 1, 8, 15, 22, 29, April 5, 12 from 4:30-7PM

The teaching artist is Mathilde Dratwa, teaching artist for The Shakespeare Society, The Roundabout Theatre Company and The New Victory Theatre in NY. We have worked with Mathilde on many projects over several years and she is wonderful.

The students will learn how to write collaboratively and revise their work while writing a 15 minute, one act play. They will do activities on their feet to generate ideas through improvisation, theatre games and sharing and then record their ideas on paper. They will learn about goals, obstacles, tactics and conflict as pillars of dramatic writing. Each class will include exercises in ensemble-building, trust, focus, projection and increasing the students' confidence, particularly while speaking in front of a group. Every word will be written by the ensemble from the title to the last period.

The culmination of the festival will be a presentation by the students of their play for parents, family & friends. There are opportunities for those who really like acting, and smaller parts for those who don't like to be in the spotlight. There are also opportunities to work behind the scenes, for example as an assistant director, narrator or stage manager for those who don't want to perform.

Scholarship

A four-year scholarship of \$2,000 a year. The four-year scholarship winner must maintain college grades in the upper bracket and must continue teacher preparation training for all 4 years.

Two one-year scholarships of \$1500 for your freshmen year.
