Happy Fall, Ludlowe! We hope everyone (students and families) has successfully settled in to the new school year. The school counselors have been busy meeting with freshman students in small groups to help students acclimate to FLHS and getting the seniors ready to apply to college! At this time, please take a moment to see that you and your child are able to access Infinite Campus so you can stay on top of grades and absences. The department will be utilizing the Remind app this year as a way to get reminders about appointments and important information to students. All counselors will be visiting homerooms over the next few weeks to get students registered.

PSAT Information

- All students in grades 9-11 will be taking the PSAT on October 10th.
- Sophomores and juniors will be receiving practice workbooks in homerooms. We recommend students practice prior to the test in order to be best prepared.
- Freshmen will be taking the PSAT 8/9 for the first year!
 This will give students a baseline we can use in preparation for the PSAT they'll take in 10th grade.
- Seniors have the option of attending a college visit or participating in a job shadow. Students must return the top half of the letter they received in homeroom letting us know their plans for the day by October 5th.

- Print the confirmation page and use it as your pass.
 Have your teacher sign and bring it with you to the college visit.
